

Speaker

Sergeant Bruce R. Talbot retired in 2002 after 25 years of police service and has become a noted national speaker on the topic of gateway drugs. Sergeant Talbot 's specialty is teaching drug and alcohol recognition classes across the country for different corporations. Sergeant Talbot is the lead drug and alcohol instructor for the Suburban Police Academy at the College of DuPage.

Sergeant Talbot has been qualified in criminal court as an expert witness in the field of drug and alcohol impairment DUI trials in Illinois and Texas. He has twice been called to testify as an expert witness before two U.S. Senate Committees. His testimony has been published in the Congressional Record.

A published author in both the popular press as well as scientific research journals, Sergeant Talbot's most recent research collaboration was published in The Journal of Human Behavior in The Social Environment, Vol. 2, Number 3, 1999.

Sergeant Talbot holds a Master of Public Administration degree from Roosevelt University and a B.S. degree in law enforcement from Southern Illinois University, and is a graduate of The School of Police Staff and Command at Northwestern University.
